1 Introduction



CAUTION

Read this user manual carefully and retain it for later use.

The Allora 3 is a portable communication device with which spoken messages can easily be generated. The Allora 3 uses text-to-speech technology. This technology ensures that any text message that is drafted on the keyboard of the Allora 3, is read out in a high-quality voice.

The person listening to the drafted message can also read along on the device's partner display.

The Allora 3 can be linked to a smartphone by Bluetooth. This allows you to send and receive text messages using the Allora 3. The Allora 3 has a communication support function and is intended for people with a communication impairment (unable to speak or able to speak with difficulty) for general use in everyday life and, assuming they have sufficient motor and cognitive abilities, to use the device. The device is not suitable for clinical, therapeutic or diagnostic use.

The Allora 3 is also equipped with an infrared module used to be able to be trained the infrared codes and transmit them to thereby control other appliances. This includes appliances for general use such as devices for audio-visual and home automation applications. This extension is not suitable for clinical, therapeutic or diagnostic use.

The Allora 3 is portable but you can also mount it to a wheelchair. To facilitate portability, it is equipped with a carry case. The Allora 3 is easy to operate and has extensive functions to support communication.

2 Intended use

The device has a communication support function. This device is intended for general use in everyday life for people with a communication impairment (who are not able to speak or cannot speak clearly). Users must have adequate motor and cognitive abilities to use the device.

The device is designed for use indoors and outdoors.

3 Prohibited use

The device may not be used for clinical, therapeutic or diagnostic purposes.

The device may not be used for purposes other than those specified in its intended use.

No modifications may be made to the device without consulting with and gaining permission from Jabbla. Making modifications to the device can have consequences for safety, the warranty and compliance with regulations.

4 Service life

The expected service life of the device is 5 years. The quality and service life of the battery depend on use.

5 The Allora 3 identification plate

You will find the label with the serial number of the device on the rear panel of the device.




Figure 1: Allora 3 identification plate

B Description and operation

1 Introducing the Allora 3



Figure 2: Front view

No.	Identification	Explanation
1	Light sensor	The light sensor measures the ambient light intensity and on this basis illuminates the keyboard.
2	USB-C	You can charge the device using this port.
3	Battery charge indicator	The battery charge indicator lights up as soon as the device is connected to the mains through the supplied power adapter. The indicator is amber while charging. The indicator changes to green once the battery is charged.
4	Headphone socket	This output is for connecting headphones to the device. The speakers are automatically disabled when you connect the headphones.
5	Microphone opening	This is the microphone opening which is used for sound to reach the device's internal microphone. The device has 1 integrated microphone.
6	On/off indicator	The on/off indicator lights up when the device is on with the following color:
		 Green: when the battery is more than half-charged. Orange: when the battery is less than half-charged, but the device does still not need to be recharged. Red: when the battery needs to be recharged.
7	Infrared receiver	With the infrared receiver you can train infrared codes to the device.
8	Keyboard	Rubberized backlit keyboard. The back light brightness is controlled by the light sensor.




Figure 3: Rear view

No.	Identification	Explanation
10	Fastening holes for a strap	The supplied strap can be fastened here to allow you to conveniently carry the device.
11	Handle / tray stand	Sturdy handle with opening for attaching a strap. The handle is also designed to be a stand. It is designed so that the device can be ergonomically placed on a tray.
12	Speakers	The device has two powerful speakers.
13	Partner display	The Allora 3 is equipped with a partner display on which text can be displayed.
14	Infrared transmitter	You can transmit infrared signals to other appliances with the Infrared transmitter. This includes sound systems, television.

Optional mounting plates for the REHADAPT mounting system or the DAESSY mounting system can also be provided.

2 Options

- The Allora 3 can be supplied with an optional REHADAPT mounting system or a DAESSY mounting system.
- The Allora 3 comes as standard with one language. As an option, the Allora 3 can be loaded with extra languages.

3 Operation

Using the keyboard and/or the touchscreen of the Allora 3, the user can create a message, which is read out with a high-quality voice utilizing text-to-speech technology.

The person listening to the drafted message can also read along on the device's partner display.

4 Screen

The capacitative touchscreen can be controlled in the following ways:

- With your fingers
- With a (capacitative) stylus that simulates your fingers (available from your specialist dealer or webstores)

C Safety

1 Safety



CAUTION

When mounting the device to a wheelchair, ensure that the device is securely fastened and additionally locked, so that it cannot accidentally fall off with a shock or impact.



ENVIRONMENT

The device uses a battery. Ensure the device is safely disposed of. Observe the waste regulations that apply in your region.



NOTE

If you are not using the device for a lengthy period of time, always store it with the battery fully charged. Make sure that the device is switched off.



CALITION

Avoid heat sources close to the device or areas that may become particularly hot. For example, in summer it can become very hot in a car. Temperatures that are too high may adversely affect the battery life performance.



CAUTION

The device is not watertight. Always try and avoid situations that could cause moisture or dirt to get into the device through the openings. Also take precautions when cleaning the device and follow the cleaning instructions.

The device is equipped with Wi-Fi and Bluetooth. Please observe the following safety precautions:



CAUTION

Do not use the device on a plane. Switch off the device or put into flight mode.



CAUTION

Do not use the device in hospital in the vicinity of electronic medical devices. The transmitted radio waves may affect the equipment.



CALITION

Do not use the device in an environment in which flammable gases are present (such as petrol stations).

D Getting started

1 What's in the Allora 3 box?

The Allora 3 is supplied with the following parts:

- · Power adapter with plug and cable
- Carry case
- Strap
- Keyguard (1) and clips (2)

2 First use

The device is adequately charged on delivery. A charge status between 40 % and 90 % increases the service life of the battery.

3 Fitting the keyguard

The keyguard helps users with physical dexterity issues access the keyboard more accurately.

- 1. Lay the keyguard (2) on the keyboard at the desired height setting. Rotate the keyguard if you prefer another height setting.
- 2. Fit the clips (1) (3) to secure the keyguard to the keyboard.

4 Switching on the device

Press the U key until the on/off indicator lights up.

The device first displays the start-up screen with the Jabbla slogan **We all have a voice**. When the cursor flashes, the device is ready for use.

The device starts up immediately from sleep mode.

5 Switching off the device completely

You usually put the device into sleep mode so that you can subsequently start to use it quickly. You can switch off the device completely if, for example, you want to store if for an extended period.

- 1. Press **=**.
- 2. Select (♥) General > (₺) Shutdown.

6 Typing text and speaking it out

1. Enter your text by typing it and add words and sentences using word prediction and sentence prediction. Press \bigcirc to type in digits and on $\models \mathbb{N} + \Omega$ to enter special characters.



TIP

You can use digits without Num Lock being active by pressing and holding the numeric key.



NOTE

Press \mathbf{X} to clear text letter by letter or \mathbf{X} to clear all text.



NOTE

If you have accidentally deleted all text, then press FN + X to undo this action.

2. Press (V).

The displayed text is read out.

7 Keyboard shortcuts



NOTE

Press the keys in succession. You do not need to hold down the FN or Shift key.

8 Using word and sentence prediction

When word and/or sentence prediction are enabled, you can automatically select words and/or sentences that have been trained or added yourself while you type. You can set whether you want to do this only using the touchscreen or also using the keyboard.

- 1. Start to type the word or sentence.
 - The predicted words/sentences are displayed at the bottom of the screen.
- 2. Choose one of the following options:
 - Using the touchscreen: tap on the word or sentence.
 - Using the keyboard: press the digit stated next to the word or sentence.



NOTE

Press \rightarrow and \leftarrow to show another series of predictions.

9 Adding a word or sentence prediction yourself

You can add words and sentences to the word prediction list yourself.

You can also find this procedure on the device itself via = > Prediction > (i) How to....

- 1. Type the word or the sentence.
- Press ♠ + ♣.

10 Deleting word and sentences predictions

You can remove words and sentences that are predicted so that they will no longer be included in predicted text.

- 1. Do one of the following:
 - Press and hold the prediction on the touchscreen.
- 2. Confirm with ().

11 Enter special characters

In addition to the normal letters, digits and symbols that you can enter with \bigcirc (**Shift**), you can also enter special characters, which are not on your keyboard.

- 1. Press $FN + \Omega$.
- 2. Select the character.

12 Save a note

You can save text or a series of messages as a note.

- 1. Enter your text by typing it and add words and sentences using word prediction.
- Press FN + ₺.
- 3. Confirm with (2).

13 Reading out a note

1. Press Ø.

A list of previously saved notes appears on the screen.

- 2. Do one of the following:
 - Tap on the note.
 - Use the arrow keys to select the note.

The note appears in the editor.

3. Choose (v) to read out the note.

14 Deleting a note

- 1. Press Ø.
- 2. Do one of the following:
 - · Via the touchscreen:
 - 1. Check and hold down the note until the **Delete note** dialog box opens.
 - 2. Confirm with ().
 - Using the keyboard:
 - 1. Select the note using the \leftarrow and \rightarrow arrow keys.
 - 2. Press (X).

The **Delete note** dialog box opens.

Confirm with ②.

15 Save a quickfire message

A quickfire message is a message that you can have read out often and quickly. A quickfire message is not included in the text or message that you are drafting.

- 1. Do one of the following:
 - Quickly save a text as a quickfire message:
 - Press FN + ❖.
 - 2. Confirm with .
 - Save one or more new sentences as a quickfire message:
 - 1. Press 💠.
 - 2. Press \equiv or select +.
 - 3. Type a message.
 - 4. Confirm with ().

The message is added to the list of quickfire messages.

- 2. Repeat the previous step to add any more quickfire messages.
- 3. Choose **X** to close the quickfire menu.

16 Read out a quickfire message

You can have quickfire messages read out. The quickfire message does not appear on the partner display!



TIP

Would you like the text of the quickfire message to appear on the partner display? Save the text as a note and open the note.

- Press .
- 2. Do one of the following:
 - Tap on the quickfire message.
 - Press the number of the quickfire message.

The quickfire message is read out.

17 Play a sound effect

You can play specified sound effects. For example, applause, a laugh, a kiss, etc. or the set call-to-attention sound.

Such a sound effect is also called a vocal emoji.

- 1. Press 💠.
- Press again or select A list of sounds appears.
- 3. Do one of the following:
 - Tap the sound.
 - Press the number of the sound.

18 Playing a call-to-attention sound

You can attract people's attention nearby by playing a call-to-attention sound.

Press FN + A.

19 Change the order of the list of quickfire messages

- 1. Press 🐟.
- 2. Select the quickfire message that you want to move using the arrow keys.
- 3. Press the space bar.
 Arrows appear in the cells.
- 4. Use the arrow keys on the keyboard to move the quickfire messages.

20 Delete a quickfire message

- 1. Press 💠.
- 2. Do one of the following:
 - Via the touchscreen:
 - 1. Check and hold down the quickfire message until the **Delete quickfire message** dialog box opens.
 - 2. Confirm with ②.
 - Using the keyboard:
 - 1. Select the quickfire message using the \leftarrow and \rightarrow arrow keys.
 - 2. Press (X).

The **Delete quickfire message** dialog box opens.

3. Confirm with (2).

21 Selecting an item without using the touchscreen

The method for selecting an item without using the touchscreen, is the same in each menu of the Allora 3.

- Go to the menu item that you wish to select.
 For example, notes, quickfire messages, messages, the menu, etc.
- 2. Press the ← or → arrow keys to select an item.

The selection is highlighted.

3. Press Ø to select the Item.

22 Retrieve the message history

You can retrieve the most recent messages. The number of messages displayed depends on the setting.

Press FN + Ø.

23 Automatically translate the text that has been entered and have it read out

To automatically translate text, you must:

- · be connected to a Wi-Fi network,
- · have selected a language you want to translate into.

You can automatically translate text that has been entered and have it read out if translation mode is enabled.

- 1. Switch on translation mode. Press $FN + \bigcirc + \bigcirc$
- 2. Draft the sentence you want to translate.
- 3. Press (V).

The sentence is translated. Where applicable, you can enter any further changes.

4. Press 🕢 again.

The sentence is read out and displayed on the partner display. If the voice for this language is not available on the device, then the translated sentence will still be displayed on the partner display.

24 Store the device for an extended period

- 1. Charge the device to approximately 50 %.
- 2. Shut down the device.



NOTE

The device must not be in sleep mode!

- 3. Keep the device in a dry place at room temperature (20 °C).
- 4. Charge the battery every 3 months to approximately 50 %. If you drain the battery, the device will no longer start.

1 Put the device manually into sleep mode

Sleep mode is an energy-saving mode that allows you to quickly wake up the device again. You can also set if and when the device automatically enters sleep mode.

Briefly press ().

Wake the device from sleep mode

The device is in sleep mode when the screen is off and the on/off indicator is lit. If the indicator is not lit, then the device is completely off.

Briefly press (1).

You can also wake the device from sleep mode by long pressing on the touchscreen provided that this has been set up. The screen will immediately light up.

3 Charge the device

The amount of time for which you can use the device without needing to charge it depends greatly on how you use the device and on:

- The volume
- The time set before it switches to sleep mode
- Bluetooth and Wi-Fi use

If the device is used a lot, it is recommended that you recharge the device every day. To do this, use only the supplied power adapter. The device can still be used while it is being charged.

It is preferable to charge the device at room temperature (about 20 °C / 68 °F). Temperatures lower than 5 °C (41 °F) and higher than 45 °C (113 °F) may adversely affect the battery.

- 1. Check the power status. See Viewing the power status on page 19.
- 2. Connect the supplied power adapter between the device USB-C port (2) and the power supply. When the battery charge indicator LED (3) lights up green, the device is fully charged.

4 Viewing the power status

View the on/off indicator (6).

- Green, when the battery is more than half-charged.
- Orange, when the battery is less than half-charged, but the device still does not need to be recharged.
- · Red, when the battery needs to be recharged.

5 Control options

5.1 Keyboard control

The Allora 3 can be operated using just the keyboard.

- Use the keyboard to draft some text or a message. To type a capital letter, you first press **Shift** and then the letter. You do not have to keep **Shift** depressed.
- You can select predictions by entering the corresponding number on the keyboard. If you want to enter a number, then you first need to press Num Lock.
- You can configure acceptance and delay times to modify the responsiveness of the keyboard to suit your preferences.
- Press the speech button 🕜 to have the types message read out.
- The menu and various parameter settings can also be operated using just the keyboard. Use the arrow keys to navigate within the menu and press the speech button (v) to confirm options.

5.2 Touchscreen control



CAUTION

Do not use sharp tools, to prevent damaging the touchscreen.



NOTE

Tap with your finger, not with your fingernail!



CAUTION

Make sure the touchscreen does not come into contact with water.

You can operate the device using just the touchscreen:

- You can choose word and sentence predictions by touching your chosen option on the screen.
- You can have a message spoken aloud by touching the message.
- You can control the menu and the different parameter settings using the touchscreen.

6 Calling and sending/receiving text messages

A bluetooth connection can be made between the device and your mobile phone. Once connected, you can use the device to call a telephone number and send text messages to people from the address book.

6.1 Switching on your device's Bluetooth

To be able to establish a connection between a different appliance, for example your mobile phone, and the Allora 3, you must switch on Bluetooth on both devices.

- 1. Press = and select Connectivity > Configure Bluetooth.
- 2. Choose .

The icon changes to ., which means that Bluetooth is enabled.

6.2 Connecting your mobile phone to the device

The connection between your mobile phone and the device depends on the brand and type of mobile phone. Below is a description of the general procedure.



NOTE

Refer to the operating instructions of your mobile phone.

- 1. Switch on Bluetooth on the device.
- 2. Switch on Bluetooth on your mobile phone.
- 3. Search for the Bluetooth name of the device from the list of available appliances and connect.
- 4. Choose the device on your mobile phone.
- 5. Confirm on your device that you wish to connect.
- 6. Check that the number matches on both devices.
- 7. Confirm this both on your device and on your mobile phone.
- Grant your mobile phone access to your contacts.
 If the connection is successful, you can use the device to make calls and send messages.

6.3 Calling a telephone number

Make sure that your mobile phone is connected to your device. See Connecting your mobile phone to the device on page 20

- 1. Press = and select | Phone.
- 2. Choose Call.

A list of the most recent conversations appears.

- 3. Choose :::.
- 4. Enter the full telephone number.
- 5. Confirm with (7).

Select o / o or press FN + F to switch the Allora 3 microphone on or off.

6. Use your device to communicate with the person that you have called.

You can prepare your message in advance.

Select or press H + H to end the call.

6.4 Calling a contact

Make sure that your mobile phone is connected to your device. See Connecting your mobile phone to the device on page 20.

- 1. Press = and select Phone.
- Choose Call.

A list of the most recent conversations appears.

- 3. Choose {图.
- 4. Do one of the following:
 - Select a contact from the list. Use the
 d and
 arrows to scroll through the address book.
 - Select Q, enter part of the name and confirm by pressing Ø. Select the contact from the search results. Select Q to clear the search results.

The contact will be called.

- 5. Select o / o or press FN + F to switch the Allora 3 microphone on or off.
- 6. Use your device to communicate with the person that you have called.

You can prepare your message in advance.

7. Select • or FN + H to end the call.

6.5 Answering or declining an incoming call

If a call comes in then everything on the Allora 3 is interrupted and the message appears that there is an incoming call.

- 1. Do one of the following:
 - Accept to accept the incoming call.
 - x Decline to decline the incoming call.
- 2. If you have declined the call, you can continue to communicate with your device.
- 3. Select on / or press FN + F to switch the Allora 3 microphone on or off.
- 4. Select or FN + H to end the call.

6.6 Sending a message to a telephone number that has been entered

Make sure that your mobile phone is connected to your device. See Connecting your mobile phone to the device on page 20

- 1. Press = and select Phone.

A list of the most recent messages appears.

- 3. Choose ☑.
- 4. Choose
- 5. Enter the full telephone number.
- 6. Confirm with ().
- 7. Type your message in.

6.7 Sending a message to a contact

Make sure that your mobile phone is connected to your device. See Connecting your mobile phone to the device on page 20.

- 1. Press = and select Phone.

A list of the most recent text conversations appears.

 - Select Q, enter part of the name and confirm by pressing Q. Select the contact from the search results. Select Q to clear the search results.

If there is no telephone number linked to the contact, nothing will happen if you choose the contact. If a contact is stored with multiple telephone numbers in your address book, then a screen appears to select the desired telephone number.

The contact will be called.

- 5. Confirm with ().
- 6. Type your message in.

6.8 Calling or texting a contact

Make sure that your mobile phone is connected to your device. See Connecting your mobile phone to the device on page 20

- 1. Press = and select | Phone.
- 2. Choose (A) Contacts.
- 3. Do one of the following:
 - Select a contact from the list. Use the **〈** and **〉** arrows to scroll through the address book.
 - Select Q, enter part of the name and confirm by pressing Q. Select the contact from the search results. Select Q to clear the search results.

If there is no telephone number linked to the contact, nothing will happen if you choose the contact. If a contact is stored in your address book including multiple telephone numbers, then a screen appears to select the desired telephone number.

- 4. Choose one of the following options:
 - **Call**. The contact will be called. Proceed with step 5.
 - ☑, **Send text**. Proceed to step 9.
- 5. Select o / o or press FN + F to switch the Allora 3 microphone on or off.
- 6. Use your device to communicate with the person that you have called.

You can prepare your message in advance.

- 7. Select or FN + H to end the call.
- 8. There is no need to continue to read the next steps. These are only intended if you have chosen to send a text message to the contact.
- 9. Type your message in.



TIP

Choose (c) to add an emoticon.

10. Choose ➤ to send the message or choose ☒ if you do not wish to send the message.

If sent successfully, a ✓ appears next to the message.

6.9 Sending a new message as part of an existing text conversation

Make sure that your mobile phone is connected to your device. See Connecting your mobile phone to the device on page

- 4. Choose ☑.
- 5. Type your message in.

7 Using the device environmental control

The device is equipped with an infrared receiver (7) and an infrared transmitter (14). This enables you to control appliances such as televisions, radios and DVD players using infrared codes. The device can be trained with the infrared codes for the appliances.

7.1 Adding an infrared appliance

- 1. Press = and select Connectivity > infrared.
- 2. Choose + to add an infrared appliance.
- Enter the name of the appliance.For example, TV living room
- 4. Confirm with (7).
- 5. Specify the length of the code.

The length of the code should be set by a process of trial and error. If the length of the code is set to be too short, the appliance may not receive all of the information that it needs. If the length of the code is set to be too long, the appliance may become confused.

Example: if you wish to turn down the volume of your television by 5 units in one go, you can set the length of the code to 5.

6. Confirm with **(**...).

7.2 Changing the name and length of the code for an infrared appliance

- 1. Press = and select Connectivity > infrared.
- 2. Choose the infrared appliance using the arrow keys.
- 3. Press .
- 4. Change the name of the infrared appliance.
- Confirm with Q.
- 6. Change the length of the code.

The length of the code should be set by a process of trial and error. If the length of the code is set to be too short, the appliance may not receive all of the information that it needs. If the length of the code is set to be too long, the appliance may become confused.

Example: if you wish to turn down the volume of your television by 5 units in one go, you can set the length of the code to 5.

7. Confirm with (2).

7.3 Training an infrared code

Your existing appliance that you have already added can be trained new infrared codes.

- 1. Press = and select (Connectivity > infrared.

It is essential to regularly check the device for updates to ensure improvements in functionality and security.

Remember that you cannot use the device when installing the update.

- 1. Check that your Wi-Fi connection is active.
- 2. Press = .
- Select క్రిఫ్ General.

If an update is available, it will display which update it is. You are prompted whether you wish to download it.

5. Confirm with **(**...).

In the **General** screen, you can monitor what % of the update has been downloaded. During this time, you can continue to work on the device.

- 6. Check in the **General** screen whether the update has been downloaded in full.
- 7. Select Install update.
- 8. Confirm with (7).

The following message appears: **Update** is **being** carried out. **Please** wait. **Do not** switch off the device. You may not use the device. You must wait until the update has been completed.

The device reboots.

9. You can continue to work on the device.

You can find the version of the software via $\{\tilde{c}\}$ General > (i) System info.

2 Maintenance

2.1 Repairs

In the event of damage to the device, please contact the distributor of the device.

Do not attempt to carry out any repairs yourself. This could damage the device and invalidate your warranty.

2.2 Cleaning the device

Clean the device regularly so you do not give bacteria the chance to spread.

It is best to remove dust with a dry, soft cloth. For minor stains on the casing, use a damp cloth. Do not use a product containing alcohol, ammonia or abrasive agents. Make sure no moisture can enter through the openings (such as, the microphone openings or the connectors). Any dirt near the connectors can be removed with a cotton bud.

To clean the screens, also use a dry cloth; do not use kitchen paper as this may cause tiny scratches. To remove grease or stains from the screens, it is recommended that you use cleaning agents specifically designed for cleaning screens (aerosol or wipes). Do not press too hard on the screens when cleaning.

Clean the keyboard with cleaning agents specifically intended for this purpose. Always use a damp cloth for this.

Clean the carry case with a dry or slightly damp cloth or a soft hand brush.

3 Troubleshooting

3.1 Finding the Allora 3 serial number

In your dealings with the support department, you will be asked to supply the serial number of your device.

You will find the label with the serial number of the device on the rear panel of the device.

3.2 Retrieving the version of the software

In your dealings with the support department, you will be asked to supply the software version on your device.

- Press = .
- 2. Select (General > (i) System info.
- 3. View the software version.

The serial number of the device is also displayed here.

3.3 Viewing the operating instructions

Via the QR code on the screen, you have access to the most recent operating instructions or web help system for this device.

- Press = .
- 2. Select ⟨ó⟩ General > + More options > □ User manual.
- 3. Using your smartphone, scan the QR code and open the operating instructions or web help system for this device.

3.4 Locking the settings with the administrator password

You can use this procedure in case you have forgotten the password and the settings are locked.

- 1. Press **=**.
- Choose ξόζ General.
- 3. Enter the password extrams.
- Choose <u>■ Menu > ⊕ Set password</u>.
- 5. Do one of the following:
 - View and remember the current password.
 - Delete the password if you want to disable settings being locked.
 - Change the password to a new password.

6. Confirm with Ø.

3.5 Troubleshooting

Problem	Solution
The touchscreen is slow or is not working properly.	 Restart the device to correct any software errors. Clean the touchscreen. See Cleaning the device on page 41. An acceptance time or delay after making a selection may have been set. See Set how long you have to touch the screen for on page 35 or Setting how much time is required between two screen touches on page 35.
The touchscreen is slow to respond.	The touchscreen is off. Switch the touchscreen back on. See Enabling the touchscreen on page 35.
The device cannot be woken from sleep via the touchscreen.	This is a setting. See Setting to wake the device from sleep mode via the touchscreen on page 36.
The device is getting hot.	During long and intensive use of the device, the device can become hot. This is normal and has no effect on the life or performance of the device.
No Bluetooth appliances found.	 Make sure that Bluetooth is enabled on the appliance you want to connect to. Make sure your device and the other appliance are within the maximum range of 10 meters. If necessary, remove any objects between the device and the other appliance. The other appliance may not be compatible with your device.
The device cannot be switched on.	The battery has insufficient charge for starting the device. Connect the power supply and switch the device on.
The battery is not charging properly.	If the battery can no longer be charged to 90%, please contact the support department of the distributor where you purchased the device.
The settings are password-protected and I have forgotten the password.	See Locking the settings with the administrator password on page 42.

Decommissioning and disposal

1 **Decommissioning**

- 1. Shut down the Allora 3. See Switching off the device completely on page 12.
- 2. Remove the Allora 3 from the mounting (if applicable).
- 3. Take the Allora 3 out of the carry case (if applicable).
- 4. Remove the charger.

2 **Disposal**

Do not dispose of the device with the household waste!

Use specific collection systems to reduce the ecological impact. At the end of its service life, the device must be disassembled and disposed of in an environmentally friendly manner. Follow the current local legal requirements and contact the local authorities if in doubt.
